The Role of your Parish Council

Your Parish council is the first tier of local government, and financed through the precept, an amount of money calculated as an estimate for the coming financial year and collected as part of your Council Tax. The Councils' activities fall into three main categories: representing the local community, delivering services to meet local needs, and improving quality of life and community well-being. The Council have a vital role in acting on behalf of the communities they represent. They give views on behalf of the community, on planning applications and other proposals that affect the parish; undertake projects and schemes that benefit local residents; work in partnership with other bodies to achieve benefits for the parish; alert relevant authorities to problems that arise or work that needs to be undertaken, and help other tiers of local government keep in touch with local needs. In other words, your council can make a difference.

Some of the specific responsibilities unique to Barnton include the provision, management and maintenance of Barnton cemetery, Runcorn Road Recreational Ground, Nursery Road Recreation Ground, the War Memorial at Jubilee Corner, 17 allotments and the responsibility for appointing a range of contractors in order to service the Parish's maintenance needs.

Although Barnton Parish Council employ a Village Orderly to keep the village free from litter, The council is **not** responsible for roads, pathways or street lighting, these are the responsibility of Cheshire West and Chester County Council.
